Retirement Community Open Rehearsals

In 2015 as part of our outreach activities to the Napa Community we began a new program of free open rehearsals at The Meadows of Napa Valley Retirement Community. In 2016, we expanded the program to include The Springs Senior Living and Retirement Community. We are delighted to reach out to community locations and offer music to residents who cannot always easily access our concerts.

Bovs & Girls Club

As part of the festival's outreach work each year, we hold a day of interactive performances at the Boys and Girls Clubs in Napa and American Canyon for ages 6 – 12. These family friendly performances inspire the children to write a song, try an instrument, listen and participate in music.

Scholarship Program

For the past five years, we have partnered with the Napa Valley Youth Symphony Orchestra in a program designed to help promising young music students in the Napa Valley with the cost of music lessons. We provide funds to cover the cost of one year of music lessons for deserving high school musicians and members of the Orchestra.

Our Music for the Community program is made possible through the proceeds of our generous patrons who give to our annual Gail and Harry Adams Resident Artists Fund.



As a result of the expansion of our community outreach and youth education programs, Music in the Vineyards is creating a three-week, full-scholarship String Quartet Apprenticeship Program for an emerging young ensemble. This will allow for additional MITV performance opportunities in the community—more Boys and Girls clubs summer children's

The ensemble will be selected by competitive audition after conducting a nation-wide search, and will benefit from coaching with resident MITV musicians.

concerts, informal performances at

summer Farmers Markets and other

unconventional venues.

Additionally, they will be included in regular performances as part of the MITV roster of musicians. This apprenticeship program would continue a time-honored tradition of mentoring young musicians as happens typically at other well-known chamber music festivals such as Marlboro, Santa Fe and La Jolla.

Thanks to the support of the Napa Valley Performing Arts Foundation, the search is underway for the first Music in the Vineyards Apprenticeship String Quartet — look for them in our 2018 community outreach/youth education programs and festival appearances!

Violinist Daria Adams, is the founding Artistic Director of Music in the Vineyards along with her husband Michael. She is a member of the world-renowned St. Paul Chamber Orchestra where she is featured in solo and chamber music performances as well. Other festival appearances include The Bach Dancing and Dynamite Society, Banff, Newport and Cactus Pear Festivals, Daria spent four years playing in the Santa Fe Opera Orchestra, where she took an interest in another musician lurking suspiciously in the back of the pit, her current husband. His interest remains mutual.

Once upon a time, violist Michael Adams dreamed of playing in a string guartet, long before other opportunities allowed him to carve out a unique career path: as a public radio host, orchestral player, chamber musician, writer on music, host of the Minnesota Orchestra's Adventures in Music family concerts, and along with his wife Daria, the founding Artistic Director of Music in the Vineyards Festival. As MITV's concert commentator and host, his goal is to share with audiences the many fascinating and oddly curious stories about music and composers that often go untold. Michael joined the Minnesota Orchestra in 1988 after a successful stint as a Host/Producer for classical WCAL-FM in Minneapolis/St. Paul, and later, for Minnesota Public Radio.

Perhaps more remarkable is the fact that they attempt the impossible in most performances: playing scores completely from memory! They are currently Hixson-Lied Artists-in-Residence at the Glenn Korff School of Music at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and were the Artists-in-Residence at Harvard University from 2008-2014. For the 2015-2016 season the Chiara was the quartet-in-residence at The Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York.

The Escher Quartet takes its name from Dutch graphic artist M.C. Escher, inspired by Escher's method of interplay between individual components working together to form a whole.

Francisco was awarded the First Prizes in the 2015 Munetsugu International Violin Competition in Japan, the 2014 Johannes Brahms Competition, the 2014 Julio Cardona International Competition and the Pablo de Sarasate Violin Competition of Spain. This fall, Orchid Classics will release Fullana's debut recording, including Max Richter's "Four Seasons Recomposed" with the City of Birmingham Symphony Orchestra. A passionate chamber musician, Francisco was appointed as the new Principal Violinist of the St. Paul Chamber Orchestra and is also the Co-Artistic leader of San Antonio's Chamber Music Institute. Francisco currently performs on the 1735 "Mary Portman" ex-Kreisler Guarneri del Gesu violin, kindly on loan from Clement and Karen Arrison through the Stradivari Society of Chicago.



David Harding, viola

Conductor and clarinetist Osmo Vänskä was born in Finland and began his clarinet studies at the age of 11. In the 1980s Osmo successfully transitioned from clarinetist to conductor and went on to hold some of the world's most prestigious conducting posts, including Music Director of the Minnesota Orchestra. Actually, the transition was rather brief: Vänskä won the 1982 Besançon Young Conductors Competition and thereafter turned largely to conducting, landing his first major post in 1985, when he was appointed guest conductor of the Lahti Symphony Orchestra. Since that time Vänskä has held a half-dozen or so major posts and appeared on more than 100 recordings. As a conductor, Mr. Vänskä has been the Music Director of the Minnesota Orchestra since 2003 and is a frequent guest conductor of leading orchestras around the world and more recently has enjoyed returning to the clarinet, performing chamber music regularly in Europe, the United States and Asia.
